### *About the Speaker*

Betty Jean Craige is Professor Emeritus of Comparative Literature and Director Emeritus of the Willson Center for Humanities and Arts at the University of Georgia. She received her B.A. in Spanish Literature from Pomona College (1968), and her M.A. (1970) and Ph.D. (1974) in Comparative Literature from the University of Washington. She has taught at the University of Georgia since 1973.

Dr. Craige has published books in the fields of Spanish poetry, modern literature, history of ideas, politics, ecology, and art. Her publications have garnered acclaim and numerous awards, including the Frederic W. Ness Book Award from the Association of American Colleges, the Georgia Author of the Year, and First Place in Short Documentary at the Indie Gathering film festival.

Additionally, she has published a series of humorous diary entries under the pseudonym Betty Dowdy, collected at [bjcraige.myweb.uga.edu/dowdy](http://bjcraige.myweb.uga.edu/dowdy). Her essays have appeared in PMLA, *The Chronicle of Higher Education*, *The Atlanta Journal-Constitution*, and *The Athens Banner-Herald*.

Dr. Craige has received the UGA Alumni Association's Faculty Service Award (1994), the Albert Christ-Janer Award for Creativity in Research (2003), the Blue Key Service Award (2010), and the Women's Studies Faculty Award (2011). She has received several awards for teaching, including the Honoratus Medal from the Honors Program. UGA granted her the title University Professor in 1995, the highest recognition for significant impact on the university. In 2004, she received the Governor's Award in the Humanities.

Dr. Craige is Co-Founder and Co-Director of the Delta Prize for Global Understanding.
